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### ASSOCIATION MISSION STATEMENT

### 2024 SELECTION COMMITTEE GUIDELINES

### I. BEFORE YOU BEGIN THE REVIEW PROCESS

- 1. Review the mission of the Association (pg. 2).
- 2. Review your Selection Committee packet in full. Pay careful attention to the 2024 Scholarship Selection Online Review Directions (pg. 8).
- 3. Consider these key award criteria:
  - a. Resiliency
    - i. Highly resilient students:
      - 1. Mentally reframe experiences with adversity by viewing challenges as positive life experience rather than debilitating misfortunes. Adopting such a mentality empowers students to create a perspective where positive impacts can be identified in even dire circumstances, shape their value system to be more sociocentric rather than ego-centric, and become more mature, responsible, accountable, independent, and/or self-sufficient;
      - 2. Take action to remediate or counteract their adversity; they take responsibility for their own lives and seek out support to help vulnerable relatives (younger siblings, ailing parents or grandparents);
      - 3. Possess the motivation to endure sacrifice and hard work in the pursuit of a future free of adversity. They demonstrate the ability to delay gratification.
      - 4. They are able to see the world outside of themselves and give back to their communities through service.

### b. Belief in the American Dream

i. In 2022 the Association added an essay to the application asking students to describe their American Dream and what significance the concept of the American Dream has on their life. It is important that the students selected have a vision in line with the Association's belief that the American Dream is possible for anyone.

### c. Academic achievement/College pathway

- i. GPA greater than 2.8
- ii. High-level math courses (ideally more than algebra)
- iii. 4 years of English

### II. COMMITTEE OPERATIONS

- 1. Applications are assigned to committee members by state. You will only be able to read and rate applications from your assigned states.
  - a. Each application includes:
    - i. Completed online application
    - ii. High school transcript(s)
    - iii. Counselor certification
    - iv. Support form
- 2. All committee members are required to complete an evaluation for each assigned applicant. Complete the form by clicking the applicant's name, completing the evaluation and recommendation sections and pressing *Submit*.
- 3. Provide a rank to each applicant. Applicants will receive a National Scholarship, State Scholarship, or position on the waitlist based on their rank.

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4. Every applicant in the pool belongs there. **Unfortunately, not all students will be able to receive this scholarship.** We request that you take this under consideration as you rank some above others.

### III. WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN READING AN APPLICATION

### 1. Adversity

- a. Age of Occurrence
- **b.** Duration of Adversity
- **c.** Ability to reframe experience
- d. Essays

<u>Note</u>: This can be one of the most difficult areas to rate. We do not seek to reward the hardest stories or the ones with the most adversities. All the applicants have a number of adversities working against them. Consider the ability of the student to continue to persevere through their adversity and if the student is likely to be successful in college given their current challenges.

#### 2. Involvement

- a. Community Service
- **b.** Family Responsibilities
- c. Extracurricular Activities
- **d.** Work Experience

<u>Note</u>: A willingness to share personal gifts with others and demonstrating leadership potential are desirable traits. Consider the quality, not quantity, of service activities as well as the length of service in a given activity. Take into consideration the applicant's workload and involvement at home as well.

### 3. Academic Achievement

- **a.** Grade Point Average (GPA)
- **b.** Course Load and Rigor
  - i. AP/Honors, dual enrollment and counselor assessment

<u>Note</u>: Please consider the applicant's number of honors classes taken as it relates to the number offered. We are not penalizing those who have not had the opportunity to pursue those higher-level courses but taking into consideration those who have had the option and not selected to engage at that level.


### 4. Support Form

- **a.** The *Support Form* provides the opinion of an unrelated adult concerning the likelihood of the applicant to complete a bachelor's degree program and the potential challenges the applicant will encounter.
- **b.** Support Form providers are asked to confirm or deny adversity statements made by the applicant. Providers have access to the Adversity Section of the application when supplying feedback. Review comments for both credibility and strength of endorsement.
- **c.** Consider the *Support Form* provider's note regarding the challenges the applicant will face in obtaining their degree if it is something other than financial.
- **d.** Support Form providers should **not be related to the applicant.** If you find that a relative completed an applicant's Support Form, please contact the Association immediately.


## 2024 SCHOLARSHIP SELECTION ONLINE REVIEW DIRECTIONS

All reviews will be completed via SmarterSelect. Please follow the steps below to begin the review process.


- \*\*Applications will not be assigned to you until the week of selection, but we do ask you create an account and familiarize yourself with the software prior to the start of the selection that week. \*\*
- 1. If you have not reviewed with us before, you will receive an invitation via email by April 10<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup> and this invitation has a clickable link "Activate Account" that will take you to SmarterSelect to establish your new user account. You will only need to create a new password.




2. If you have reviewed with us before, simply **sign in to your** *Reviewer Account* at <a href="https://app.smarterselect.com/login">https://app.smarterselect.com/login</a>



3. You will be presented with the "My Evaluations" table which serves as your home page in SmarterSelect. What you see will vary slightly from the example below. If you evaluate more than one program for us – please make sure the large arrow menu at the top reads 2024 Horatio Alger Scholarship Application.




- 4. Use the actions column to click **Read** to review and/or score an application.
- 5. You can sort your table by clicking on any of the column headings. The + (shown as above on the left hand side) will expand your table to show additional columns & your comments section. The "i" will provide the program description and requirements for the scholarship. The direction arrows at the top of your table will allow you to navigate to other pages in your evaluations table.
- 6. The status column tells you your status on the application –**Not Started** it hasn't been opened by you. Once you have begun, the status will change to **Reading**. Once you complete and submit your evaluation, the status will change to **Evaluated**. You may save your progress and return later to finish and you may make edits to your evaluations up until the deadline, even if it is completed.
- 7. Once you click **Read**, you will be taken to the application. The evaluation form is integrated with the application so the scoring and/or comment fields are located by the particular information you are evaluating.
- 8. You will be reviewing three major sections Adversity, Involvement and Academic Achievement
- 9. All areas for you to complete are found in blue boxes, making them distinct from the application itself.





Elements of what you will see in the three review sections include – what to consider; what are the applicable parts of the application; and how you rate the candidate in that category. Comments are requested, but not required, at the end.

### Online Review Directions - continued




10. Transcripts are included with the application for your review. PDFs and image files can be viewed directly in the application by clicking the eye/view icon. To download and open all other files for review, click the download cloud icon. You can right click on the download icon and select open in new tab. This will not download the transcript, but rather open in a larger view than the can be seen in the preview window.






This year we are also asking you to rate the American Dream essay based on the practical support and belief that an applicant has for this concept and how it affects their future. We are looking for students who believe in, and support the Association's goal to "dispel the belief that the American Dream is no longer attainable."



11. Final recommendations are made using this page – your rank is also submitted here.



We will assist in providing you a report that can be used to sort/filter your evaluation data to help you rank your states. We are also able to assist you in entering this data.




You can easily delete the columns that don't have the data you need and can still do ranking on this form. Please remember to put those ranks back on your evaluations or submit your excel worksheet to Heather and she will enter the ranks on your behalf!

We recommend you do this with this excel file to ensure data integrity:


1. After you open the file – Select Insert from the top menu




2. Click on the first cell A1 that contains your data




- 3. Select Tables from the Table Grouping on the Insert Tab
  - a. This will automatically select all of your data



- 4. Verify that the "My table has headers" box is checked and click **OK**.
- 5. If you see this message, click **Yes** to continue.
  - b. This will allow you to sort columns based on any of the questions that you want and will keep the data grouped with the correct applicant. You can also delete the columns that do not contain information or contain the score data.



12. Click Save & finish later to save your progress and return at a later date. After completing your review on that application, press Submit. This will mark the evaluation as Evaluated and help you know what you have left to review.



13. You can review an application that you have evaluated by clicking read on the original chart. You will find an update button in place of the submit button. Best practice is not to submit until you are ready so that all applications will be shown in "not started" or "reading" phase on your chart.



14. Submit all rankings for all assigned states by 12:30 pm on Monday, April 22. You will not be able to edit your review after this deadline.

### **PLEASE NOTE**

All applications include the option to mark as "Do Not Recommend". You will find this option at the bottom of each individual application review page in the final Recommendation & Ranking section. We ask that you still rank each application, but, if you feel an application does not align with our selection criteria, you may now mark that application accordingly.

### 2024 SCHOLARSHIP SELECTION SCREENING PROCESS

### 1. Application Evaluation and Scoring Process

All applications received are scored by the computer rating system and reviewed for completeness. Applications are scored and weighted across six different areas:

- 40% Adversity
- 25% Academic Achievement
- 12% Work
- 10% Financial Need
- 8% Community Service Activities
- 5% Co-Curricular

### 2. Scholarship Committee

Top applications are submitted in April to the Selection Committee. The Committee is composed of Association Members, high school and college educators from across the nation, and Horatio Alger Association Alumni Scholars.

### 3. Scholarship Verification and Notification Process

Scholarship Committee recommendations that are reviewed by Horatio Alger Association senior staff to ensure the accuracy of application materials and the consistency of recommendations within the Association's programmatic guidelines.

National and State Scholarship awardees are notified by telephone, email, and mail. Once awardees have signed-off online, letters are sent to notify principals that a student at their school has been awarded a scholarship.
